



The Yearly Pest Calendar for Your Home

As the seasons change, different pests become active threats to your home, and understanding when and where they strike is the first step toward keeping them out year-round.

Winter: The Hidden Invaders



MAIN PESTS



Mice—Seek shelter in basements, kitchens, and wall voids



Squirrels—Nest in attics and insulation, chewing wires and wood



Bats—Hide in attic rafters and soffits, often unnoticed

Risk Level: Moderate, but infestations grow silently over time

Spring: The Swarm Awakens



MAIN PESTS



Ants—Scout early for food; colonies mobilize quickly



Termites—Swarms appear, indicating underground colonies



Wasps—Queens emerge and begin new nests; sightings rise, but nests are small



Mosquitoes—Early rains create standing water that jump-starts breeding

Risk Level: Moderate to high, as emerging pests begin establishing new colonies

Summer: Peak Season Mayhem



MAIN PESTS



Wasps—Nest size and aggression increase significantly



Ticks—Highly active in shaded, grassy, or wooded areas



Mosquitoes—Rapid reproduction in warm, wet conditions

Risk Level: High, with widespread pest activity and increased health risks

Fall: The Sneaky Setup



MAIN PESTS



Rodents—Search for warm shelter as outdoor temperatures begin dropping

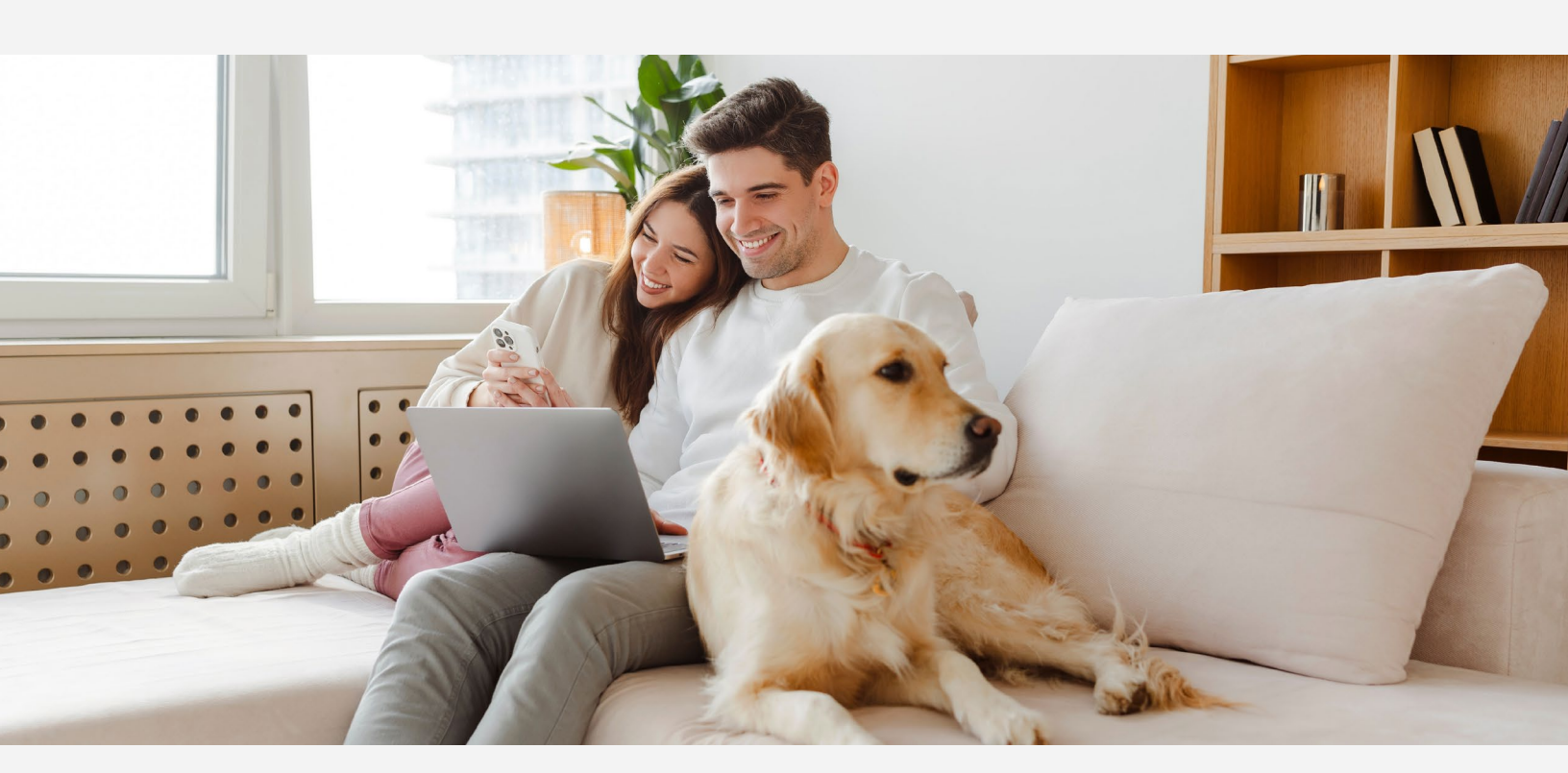


Wasps—Remain active and attracted to sugary food sources outdoors



Ticks—Adult ticks seek blood meals before winter dormancy begins

Risk Level: Moderate, as some pests prepare to move indoors



Work to Protect Your Home Before They Move In



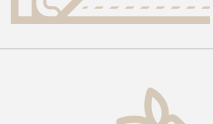
Declutter garages, attics, and basements

Use mechanical traps and bait in high-risk zones



Monitor for termite mud tubes and swarms



Eliminate standing water in yards and planters
